A letter from the director

As we all know, 2021 was a year of unfathomable change. KALP was not exempt from the impact of COVID-19, but the organization faced unrelated change as well. Chris Meisenheimer, who founded KALP in 2013, retired from the position of director in August 2020. Not wanting to see a program that is so needed in our community fade away without leadership, I volunteered to take over as director of KALP.

In order to protect volunteers, tutors and learners, KALP suspended in-person tutoring until July 2021. During that time, KALP went through rebranding, including a new logo and major overhaul of the WELCOME, Inc. website. We also built an online new tutor training course, forged new relationships with local and state organizations and businesses, and added new facets to the program.

Change can be stressful, but it can also be exciting. I'm excited to see where we've been and how we can grow. I hope you are as well.

Cultivating Family Literacy

KALP & Read Better Be Better

In August 2021, KALP partnered with Phoenix-based literacy program Read Better Be Better (RBBB). RBBB's goal is to improve children's reading comprehension before they enter fifth grade and are expected to "read to learn" versus "learning to read."

KALP's partnership with RBBB brought their at-home family literacy program to Kingman area families so Kingman kids can also be ready to "read to learn." The six week program is free to any family with a second to fourth grader in the home and includes weekly phone support from a RBBB reading coach.

KALP provided 45 program kits in 2021 and will continue the program in 2022. Families can sign up on our website and watch for future storytime events promoting the program, which are made possible by support from Angle Homes, Inc., Arizona Community Foundation, and Venture Club of Kingman.

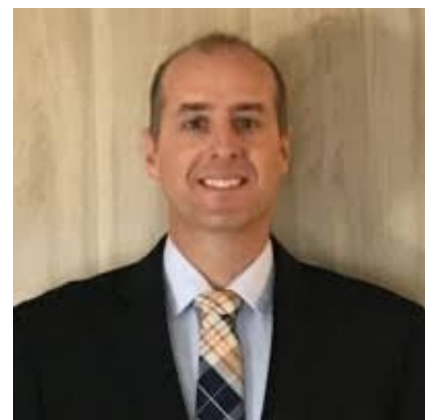

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Future Plans: Removing Barriers to Meaningful Employment

As part of KALP's ultimate goal of reducing poverty, we're launching a new initiative in 2022 to help remove barriers for Kingman adults who want to obtain employment or advance their careers.

Career certification and GED tests cost money. These tests are also challenging and sometimes require more than one attempt. Adult learners who work with a KALP tutor will be eligible to have their testing fees paid for up to two attempts thanks to the support of Medusa Farms.
